Welcome to our second Newsletter. Not long until camp so here is some more information to help us all get ready.

Child Protection

Scouts is committed to providing a safe environment for youth participating in its program. It's important that all parents and helpers familiarise themselves with some key policies relating to activities.

Two Adults present: Scouts NSW requires that when Adults are supervising and conducting Scouting activities involving Youth, at least two Adults are present, except in unexpected, unusual and unforeseen circumstances. While the minimum ratio of Adults to Youth will vary from activity to activity, a minimum of two Adults is always required. This requirement is to protect Youth and Adults and is referred to as "Two-Deep" leadership.

Ablutions: Only Adults of the same gender are to directly supervise the Youths' ablutions. In these circumstances, the guiding principle is that Adults must avoid placing themselves in a situation where they feel uncomfortable or compromised or where their actions could be misinterpreted.

Medications

All medications must be checked in at the registration table. They should be clearly labelled with name, contents, dosage and frequency. They will be kept with the first aid officer at the first aid station. If there is a special need to keep them close, please discuss this with the first aid officer.

Mobile Phone Reception

There is none! There is a landline phone onsite and all key people will have 2 way communications with the First Aid Station.
